



Queen's Counsel (QC) is an honorary designation given to lawyers who live in Saskatchewan and have practiced law for at least 10 years in the superior courts of any province or territory of Canada, the United Kingdom, or Ireland, and are recommended for this distinction by a selection committee comprised of Saskatchewan's Justice Minister, the Chief Justice of the Court of Queen's Bench for Saskatchewan or the Chief Justice of the Court of Appeal (on an alternating basis), and the past presidents of the Saskatchewan branch of the Canadian Bar Association and the Law Society of Saskatchewan.

In recognition of achieving this significant milestone in their careers, many Queen's Counsel recipients are carrying on a recent tradition of the Saskatchewan bar to commemorate their QC designation by making a charitable donation to Pro Bono Law Saskatchewan. Pro Bono Law Saskatchewan is a non-profit charitable corporation that improves access to justice for persons of limited means within Saskatchewan by creating, facilitating, and promoting opportunities for lawyers to provide high quality pro bono legal services.

In a similar fashion, Past Presidents of the Law Society of Saskatchewan are also rising to the challenge and making a donation to commemorate their year of service to the legal profession. Serving as president of the Law Society of Saskatchewan is a distinct honour carrying responsibility for governing the legal profession by upholding high standards of competence and integrity; ensuring the independence of the profession; advancing the administration of justice, the profession and the rule of law; all in the public interest.

Donations received from Queen's Counsel appointees and Past Presidents of the Law Society of Saskatchewan are directed to disbursement coverage for the benefit of clients served by lawyers who provide pro bono litigation services through Pro Bono Law Saskatchewan programs and who might not otherwise be able to pursue legal matters. This Fund provides assistance for members of the public as well as the many lawyers who volunteer to assist with pro bono files. The Fund is available due to a generous start-up contribution from the Canadian Bar Association (Saskatchewan Branch).
